Classical Competition Notes

- 1. "Aria" includes a solo selection from opera, oratorio, cantata, requiem, mass, operetta, zarzuela, or work titled "concert aria."
- 2. Selections from Purcell's semi-operas/masques will be considered songs.
- 3. Handel arias of any kind will be considered arias, even though he was a contemporary of many of the composers in the 24/26/28 Italian Songs and Arias collections.
- 4. Selections from 24/26/28 Italian Songs and Arias will be considered songs in upper and advanced categories: CL 7-8 A and B; CL 9-10 A and B; CL 13B. They can be considered songs or arias in lower categories: CL 3 and 4, CL 5-6 A and B.
- 5. English MUST BE THE ORIGINAL LANGUAGE for the required English Art Song.
- 6. Arias must be presented in the original language unless performance practice dictates otherwise.
- 7. Published transpositions are permitted.
- 8. Selections must be performed from memory.
- 9. Students may enter more than one category (i.e., Classical Division and Spirituals. Repertoire may be "double-dipped" in the preliminary division. For example, one of the Spirituals may be used as an English Art Song in the CL division. However, if the student makes the finals in both the Classical and Spirituals divisions, the Spiritual may not be performed twice.
- 10. Winners in categories CL 11, 13A, and 13B do not go to nationals. There are no adult or avocational categories for the national level planned at this time.
- 11. In the NATS MS Chapter, we do not subdivide the HS CL categories into lower and upper high school. All HS trebles, grades 9-12, compete against each other, as do all HS TBB.

Musical Theatre Competition Notes

- 1. Selections must be performed from memory.
- 2. Published transpositions are permitted.
- 3. Singers are expected to select repertoire from a wide variety of styles.
- 4. Selections should be performed in the original language unless a translation is warranted by performance practice.

- 5. Appropriate selections may be "double-dipped" in the preliminary rounds if a student is registered in both the CL and MT competitions. For example, Lonely House from *Street Scene* can be used as both an aria and MT song. However, if the student is a finalist in both categories, the song cannot be used for both.
- 6. In the NATS MS Chapter, we do not subdivide the HS MT categories into lower and upper high school. All HS trebles, grades 9-12, compete against each other, as do all HS TBB.

American Negro Spirituals Competition Notes

- 1. National is encouraging ALL students to audition in the Spirituals competition, regardless of race/ethnicity. Please keep this in mind as you prepare your students for NATS this year.
- 2. Students may use spirituals as an English Art Song selection, in the preliminary round. However, if the student makes the finals in both the Classical and AS competitions, the Spiritual may only be used in one category. In other words, no "double-dipping" in the Finals.
- 3. The categories for the American Negro Spiritual Competition are combined Treble and TBB Voices. There are two categories for the MS state chapter auditions: AS 3 High School Treble and TBB; and AS 5 Post-HS/College (undergraduate and graduate) Treble and TBB.
