A justice-centered educator, advocate and artist, Liz currently serves as Head of Vocal Instruction at the Savannah College of Art & Design. As vocal technician, Liz specializes in role preparation for stage and screen. Her clients have most recently been seen in *The Light in the Piazza* at New York City Center, Season 2 of *Somebody, Somewhere* (HBO), *Boop! The Musical and Moulin Rouge* Broadway.

Liz's professional artistic experiences span collaborations with cellist Yo-Yo Ma, Maestro Riccardo Muti and The Chicago Symphony to a range of musical and concert productions throughout the U.S. and abroad. Favorite roles include Schoenberg's *Pierrot Lunaire*, Armelia McQueen (*Ain't Misbehavin'*), Lula Buffington (*Violet*), Nettie (*Carousel*), and workshops and premieres including the alt-rock musical, *Gods & Kings, To Find Happy and Meet John Doe*. In 2022 Liz directed and facilitated Ike Holter's *Hit the Wall* at Michigan State University initiating anti-racist, anti-oppressive production practices centering student experiences, engaging in critical thought processes and uplifting local BIPOC and LGBTQ+ communities.

Liz holds degrees from Wayne State University, The University of Michigan and is a recipient of the King-Chávez-Parks Fellowship. Liz is a member of Actor's Equity and an alumn of the National Association of Teachers of Singing Professional Intern Program.
